



PROVINCIAL FORUM ON THE DISCLOSURE OF ADVERSE EVENTS

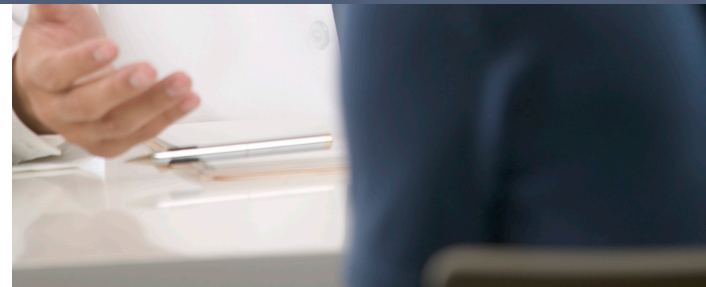
The facilitators of “DUMO” – the education strategy adopted by most Health Authorities in BC known as *Disclosing Unanticipated Medical Outcomes* – would like to invite you to participate in a dialogue on the disclosure of adverse events. Our experience in teaching the topic of disclosure continues to demonstrate the need for ongoing discussion upon several key issues that challenge effective disclosure. The purpose of this Forum is to re-energize the dialogue on disclosure so that we may continue in our journey towards open and honest communication when unanticipated outcomes in care occur. The Forum will provide participants with an opportunity to exchange knowledge and share their perspectives on the topic of disclosure.

We hope you will be able to join us for what we know will be lively dialogue and debate on this important topic.

FORUM OBJECTIVES:

1. Dialogue on the process of disclosure of adverse events based on learning over the past two years.
2. Examine the patient, health system and legal perspectives to disclosure through presentation of case studies.
3. Identify existing barriers to disclosure and develop strategies to overcome and address.
4. Initiate the development of guidelines for disclosure in situations where care is provided outside of the Hospital Act.
5. Work to develop clarity on the process of disclosure, including aspects related to s. 51 of the Evidence Act.
6. Discuss strategies for engagement in training for disclosure, particularly with physician audiences.
